Reflection for the Second Sunday of Lent (Year B)

Trials can bring out the best in us

Abraham was put to the test to confirm his faith in God. We may be put to the test through the trials we face in our lives. When we remain steadfast in the face of these trials our faith is strengthened.

The Sacrifice of Isaac Prefigures the Death of **Iesus:** God tested Abraham by asking him to sacrifice Isaac, his only Son. Obviously, God would not have allowed him to lay his hands on his son. Here, Isaac symbolizes Christ who is the only Son of God. God did not allow Abraham to sacrifice his only Son, but God gave up Jesus Christ, his only Son, for our salvation (Jn 3:16). Because God loved Abraham so much, he did not allow him to sacrifice his only Son. On the contrary it was out of his love for us that God allowed his Son to become a sacrificial offering for our sins (1 Jn 2:2; Heb 10:12). Just as Isaac carried the wood for the sacrifice, Christ also carried the Cross on which he was crucified. Also, just as Abraham loved his son, Isaac, on a divine level, God also loved Christ his only Begotten Son and called him his Beloved.

Trials Bring Out the Best in Us: In the Gospel Reading, Christ took three of his disciples up a high

mountain and he was transfigured in their presence. At the mountain of the transfiguration, the disciples only saw a glimpse of the glory of Jesus. For those who remain faithful to the last, God has promised the fullness of his glory. That refers to the best we could ever be - saints of God. So, the assurance is that we will see the fullness of the glory of God if we remain steadfast and faithful to God.

Christ Takes Us to the Mountain: Abraham was to sacrifice Isaac on the mountain where he was to encounter God. Jesus also took his disciples to a mountain where they encountered God. At every Mass, Christ brings us to the altar of God which is the new mountain where God manifests himself to us. The altar then becomes our own mountain where God dwells. From our celebration of the mysteries of God at the altar, the new mountain of sacrifice, we hope to be elevated to heaven, the mountain of transfiguration, where we shall behold, not a glimpse, but the fullness of Christ's glory. Amidst the trials of life, may the glory of God shine brightly in our lives. Amen.
