## Reflection for the Third Sunday of Lent (Year B)

**Christ purifies us** 

The season of Lent provides us with an opportunity to spiritually prepare for the celebration of the Paschal Mystery of Christ. In preparing our minds for this celebration, Christ uses the imagery of the Temple in Jerusalem to point to his death and resurrection.

The New Jerusalem Temple: When Jesus challenged the Jews to destroy the Temple and in three days, he would raise it up, they supposed that he was referring to the physical Temple built by human hands. However, Jesus was already pointing to his destiny in the hands of the leaders of the people. Indeed, they would 'destroy' the temple, which is his body, and in the three days he would raise it up. The body of Christ then becomes the New Temple of God where people are called to worship him in truth and in spirit (Jn 2:24). In other words, Christ has replaced the old temple with his own body which shall never be destroyed again. The Church of Christ is also understood as the body of Christ (Col 1:18) where the new people of God gather to worship him. Whenever we gather to worship, we worship in Christ who is the source of the unity of the Church.

The Sacrifice of Christ for the World: The 'destruction' of his body which Christ spoke about referred to his agonizing crucifixion and sacrificial death for the world. St Paul then teaches us in the Second Reading that the crucified Christ has become the power and wisdom of God through whom we are saved. By his passion and death, his body was destroyed. His body was destroyed so that a new people of God would be formed. At the Last Supper, he told his disciples that his body would be given up for them (Lk 22:19). That explains in clearer terms the symbol of his bodily death which he speaks of at the cleansing of the temple. That death was for the salvation of the world.

Christ Purifies His Temple: While we are members of the body of Christ, we are always in need of purification. As Christ purified the old temple in Jerusalem, the New Temple of Christ, the Church, is ever more in need of purification. The season of Lent then provides God's children that unique opportunity for us to purify ourselves through works of penance and charity. The Laws which God gave to the people of Israel as related in the First Reading were not to enslave them but to purify them for the love of God and their neighbours. Today, the Church, the New Temple of God, celebrates the sacraments for the purification of her children so that they would be prepared to rise with Christ on the last day when he comes in all his glory. As God gave the people of Israel his laws to guide them to the Promised Land, God has also given us the sacraments and the law of love to lead us to our Promised Homeland in heaven. May the celebration of the Paschal Mystery of Christ purify us and prepare us for the joys of heaven. Amen.
