Reflection for the Third Sunday of Eastertide

Christ's resurrection brings us new life

After his resurrection, Christ showed himself to his disciples to deepen their faith in him. He knew that they needed to see his glorious body for them to become stronger witnesses to this unfathomable work of God. Indeed, the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Risen Lord. Thus, we are also filled with joy because our Lord is risen, and his presence remains with us always.

The Resurrection of Christ Brings Us into the Communion of Saints: While they were battling with their fears and doubts, the disciples of Christ remained united, and they supported one another. Christ as well appeared to them in pairs and in groups so that their witnessing would be stronger. The Church believes in the communion of saints as she learns from the life of the early Christians who were united in prayer. They formed one family in the spirit of the Risen Christ (CCC 959). As members of the Church, we are also united with the saints through the power of Christ's resurrection which is the foundation of our faith.

The Resurrection of Christ Assures Us the Forgiveness of Sins: Apostle Peter reminded the leaders of the people of their roles in the death of Christ. His message was that in the whole event of Christ's passion in the hands of the people, God was working out his plans of salvation. Through his power, God raised Jesus from the dead. St Peter then exonerated the people of their sins, saying that they acted in ignorance. Here, Peter's words are similar to those of Jesus who prayed for and forgave those who took part in his passion and death (Lk 23:34). The remission of our sins which Christ prayed for on the cross has been accomplished in its fullness in his resurrection. When our sins are forgiven, it becomes a form of rising from our states of lowliness to meet God who lives on high.

We Profess the Resurrection of the Body: When Christ rose from the dead, he took on a glorious body. This body is real and not a phantom or a ghost. At the resurrection of the dead, our bodies will also rise in glory like that of Christ (1 Cor 15:44; Phil 3:21). Thus, the "resurrection of the flesh" (the literal formulation of the Apostles' Creed) means not only that the immortal soul will live on after death, but that even our "mortal body" will come to life again through the power of God (CCC,990, 1002). May the resurrection of Christ bring us new life as we await our resurrection and those of our loved ones. Amen.
