### **THE EPIPHANY AT THE LORD'S BAPTISM**

At Christmas and a little after the Church celebrates the Epiphany – the 'showing forth' or 'manifestation' of God to the world in the human form of Jesus Christ. Three of such celebrations are the adoration of Jesus by the Magi, the Baptism of Jesus in the Jordan, and the Presentation of the Lord Jesus.

We focus on Baptism, especially of children and how much it has become a wider celebration for family and friends. This is the day when the parents, like the Father to Jesus, proclaim: "This is my son/daughter in whom we are well pleased!" However, the celebration for the Church is much more than the family inviting everyone to rejoice at the human birth of the child, wonderful as it is! To each of us in Baptism the Holy Spirit comes making us children of God. It is the basic sacrament of "rebirth". Washed with water and consecrated by the Holy Spirit, the baptised begin a new life in Christ who died and is risen. Over each of us the Father said "You are my beloved child; with you I am well pleased!"
