ASSISTED SUICIDE DEBATE – 27TH JANUARY: On Tuesday 27th January, the Senedd will vote on whether Wales should consent to Westminster's Terminally Ill Adults (End of Life) Bill, which would legalise assisted suicide. Archbishop Mark O'Toole of Cardiff-Menevia and Bishop Peter Brignall of Wrexham have issued a joint statement ahead of this vote. A copy of the statement will be available in the porch. Also, a pastoral letter from Archbishop Mark O'Toole will be read at Masses this weekend.
